CALL TO ORDER

Trustee Robert Garvy, chair of the Educational Programs Committee, called the meeting to order at 10:20 a.m. Committee members Richard Crotty, Reid Oetjen, and Melissa Westbrook were present. Committee member Ray Gilley attended via teleconference. Board of Trustees Chair Olga Cavet was present.

MINUTES

The minutes from the September 26, 2013, meeting were approved as written.

Trustee Garvy stated that on September 25 he had the opportunity to meet with five student groups on campus to talk about the students' overall experience at UCF. Garvy noted that the experience was informative and exhilarating, and he encouraged all trustees to take every opportunity to meet with student groups.

Tony Waldrop, Provost and Executive Vice President, conveyed his gratitude to Garvy for taking the time to meet with students. He extended an invitation to all trustees to interact with UCF's outstanding faculty members and students by shadowing a faculty member for a day.

NEW BUSINESS

Conferral of Degrees (EPC-1)

Waldrop requested approval for the Fall 2013 conferral of degrees. A motion to recommend the conferral of degrees was approved.

2012-13 Program Review Results Summary (INFO-1)

Diane Chase, Executive Vice Provost, provided a brief overview of the academic program review process. The results summary of the 2012-13 program reviews that was distributed to the committee included strengths, weaknesses, and recommendations for each program that was reviewed. The results summary of the program reviews will be submitted to the Florida Board of Governors in December.

Provost's Update

Waldrop announced that Deborah German, Vice President for Medical Affairs and Dean for the College of Medicine, has agreed to chair the search committee for a dean for the College of Nursing.

Waldrop introduced Ross Hinkle as the newly selected Vice Provost and Dean for the College of Graduate Studies. Hinkle spoke briefly about his background, he talked about some of his accomplishments as interim vice provost and dean for graduate studies, and he expressed his enthusiasm for the future of graduate studies.

Trustee Garvy congratulated Hinkle and adjourned the meeting at 11:10 a.m.



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4 Guiding Principles:

- Use metrics that align with Strategic Plan goals
- Reward excellence or improvement
- Have a few clear, simple metrics
- Acknowledge the unique mission of the different institutions

Key Components:

- Funds allocated based on 10 metrics
- One metric chosen by the Board of Governors and one by the **Board of Trustees**
- Institutions evaluated on the excellence or improvement for each metric
- Data based on one year

Performance Funding Model - Basic Operation

New Appropriated Funds:

- Maximum of 50 points (5 points per metric)
- Must have 26 points or more to be eligible for new funds
- A university with 25 points or less, or the three lowest scoring universities are not eligible for new funds
- Eligible universities receive new funds allocated proportional to their recurring state base budget
- Highest scoring eligible universities will receive additional new funds



Performance Funding Model - Basic Operation

Base Recurring Funds:

- A proportional amount, equal to the amount of new appropriated funds, would come from each university's recurring state base budget
- For the first year a university would only have 1% at risk
- A university with 26 points or more would have their base funding restored
- A university with 25 points or less would have all but 1% of their base funding restored
- Funds would be reallocated proportional to the universities with more than 25 points, with the highest scoring universities eligible for more
