The proposed Bachelor of Science in Health Informatics degree program aligns seamlessly with the system's strategic planning goals of Excellence, Productivity, and Strategic Priorities for a Knowledge Economy. By addressing the intersection of healthcare and technology, the program directly contributes to these goals:

Excellence: The Health Informatics program strives for excellence by providing students with a rigorous and comprehensive curriculum that equips them with the knowledge and skills needed to excel in the health informatics field. Graduates will be well-prepared to drive innovation, optimize patient care, and contribute to advancements in healthcare technology. The program's emphasis on interdisciplinary learning and collaboration promotes excellence by fostering a well-rounded skill set that is essential for success in the rapidly evolving healthcare landscape.

Productivity: In a knowledge-driven economy, productivity is intricately linked to the ability to harness and leverage information effectively. The Health Informatics program aligns with this goal by training students to manage, analyze, and interpret health data to make informed decisions that enhance the performance of healthcare organizations and make them productive citizens.

Strategic Priorities for a Knowledge Economy: The program's focus on health informatics positions it as a strategic contributor to the knowledge economy. In today's data-driven world, the effective utilization of information is paramount. The program equips students with the skills to leverage data analytics, information systems, and technology solutions to address healthcare challenges and drive innovation.

2. The institution's strategic plan and goals the program will directly advance.

In line with the institution's strategic plan, the program embodies the following elements:

Leading Enterprise for Innovative Research and Creative Works: The program encourages innovation, and graduates will contribute to groundbreaking research by applying informatics principles to healthcare challenges.

#1 Provider of Diverse Talent: As the only BS Health Informatics program in the State University System, this program addresses the talent needs in the region and state by producing graduates equipped to meet the evolving demands of the health informatics sector.

3. The university's mission.

The proposed program strongly supports the institution's mission of enriching the human experience through inclusion, discovery, and innovation. By preparing graduates who are skilled in both healthcare and informatics, the program contributes to the enrichment of



the healthcare field through technological advancements that improve patient outcomes and experiences.

4. The benefit to the university, the local community, and the state.

This program will increase the undergraduate enrollment in the UCF School of Global Health Management and Informatics and will add to the college's budget under the new budget model. All costs associated with the implementation will be covered by existing E&G as well as auxiliary funds generated by the Health Care Informatics and Executive Health Administration Master's Program.

In the Greater Orlando area, the two major hospital systems are looking to grow and expand locally and beyond. AdventHealth is planning for significant local and regional expansion, with new hospitals, freestanding emergency rooms, and physician practice sites throughout Central Florida and beyond. Orlando Health is also expanding, seeking to provide a wider breadth of services to patients along the I-4 corridor including new hospital facilities, freestanding emergency rooms, and specialty physician services. HCA Healthcare is also continuing to expand in Florida with new facilities throughout the state. Overall, the significant and rapid growth rate of health care organizations as well as the expansion of the use of data create a perfect storm for new health informaticists to enter the career marketplace over the next decade.

The 10-year job growth rate for health informatics specialists in the state of Florida is quite high at 22%, and the national average growth for these jobs (9%) is higher than other careers nationally. This undergraduate program could help meet a need at the entry level within the state.

- B. Provide the date the pre-proposal was presented to the Council of Academic Vice Presidents Academic Program Coordination (CAVP ACG). Specify any concerns raised and provide a narrative explaining how each has been addressed in this proposal or will be addressed before the proposed program is implemented.

The pre-proposal was presented in April of 2023. Two concerns were raised as noted below:

1. Since UCF has an existing M.S. in Health Informatics (CIP 51.0706), what is the rationale for not putting this proposed bachelor's degree in the same CIP? Or changing the existing CIP to the proposed CIP 51.2706?

Based on the information shared in the definition of CIP 51.2706, this is the most appropriate descriptor of the new program being developed. The field of health informatics has evolved a great deal since 2010 when the MS in Health Informatics was launched at UCF, and although the program has evolved over that timeframe, the original CIP of 51.0706 has not been revisited since that time.

2. Also, UCF has a bachelor's in CIP 51.0706, health management, which focuses more on people and processes around the use of health information and technology. This proposed bachelor's in health informatics will focus on this but



expand the curriculum to include developing and maintaining health data and the appropriate use of it. What is the rationale for not just expanding the existing CIP instead of creating a new degree? Will this create duplication in the two programs? Will the two programs compete for students and resources?

The fields of both health information management and health informatics have been evolving rapidly over the past several years. While the two disciplines do have some overlap, there are distinctions as well.

Focus: Health information management (HIM) programs focus on the collection, organization, and management of health information (HI). This includes traditional medical records, as well as newer forms of digital health data. Health informatics programs, on the other hand, focus on the use of technology and data analytics to improve healthcare outcomes.

Career paths: Graduates with HIM degrees typically work in roles related to managing and organizing health records, such as health information manager, health information technologist, or compliance specialist. Graduates with HI degrees may work in a variety of roles, such as health information analyst, health informatics specialist, clinical informatics analyst, or health IT project manager.

Required Skills: Health information management programs typically emphasize skills such as effective communication, attention to detail, and management skills, as well as knowledge of health laws and regulations. Health informatics programs focus on skills such as data analysis, programming, and data visualization.

Curriculum: HIM programs typically cover topics such as medical terminology, health law and ethics, medical coding, quality and safety, leadership, and basic instruction in health data management. HI programs focus more in depth on areas such as data analysis, database management, privacy and security, data integrity, health information systems, and project management. The existing BS in HIIM at UCF also includes multiple courses in medical coding (CPT-4, HCPCS, and ICD-10) and common core pre-requisites such as accounting and anatomy and physiology which will not be required under the proposed BS in HI program.

Program Accreditation: Both types of programs can obtain specialty accreditation through the Commission on Accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management Education (CAHIIM). Beginning in 2023, there are separate accreditations for undergraduate programs in HIM and HI, answering the need demonstrated by the evolution of these types of programs and the changes in the industry over time.

Student Certifications: The existing bachelor's degree in health informatics and information management is a CAHIIM accredited HIM degree program focused on preparing students to achieve the Registered Health Information Administrator (RHIA) credential offered by the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA). The existing BS in HIIM at UCF also includes a coding certification through a professional practice experience course. The proposed bachelor's degree in health



informatics would meet the need of students seeking a more technically oriented program, leading toward obtaining certifications in health informatics through professional organizations focused on health informatics such as the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) and the American Medical Informatics Association (AMIA).

As noted above, there is some overlap between the two disciplines. However, to receive programmatic accreditation for both HIM and HI in a single program would be very challenging, as the requirements and expectations for each set of accreditation standards differ in areas such as faculty/leadership qualifications, curriculum content requirements, and student learning outcomes. The existing resources to support both the BS in HIIM and MS in HI will allow this program to get started at low cost/resources, to scale appropriately over time as student load increases.

This addition to our undergraduate line up in the UCF School of Global Health Management and Informatics will allow undergraduate students interested specifically in the field of health informatics to focus their energies in major in detailed study of that topic area, as opposed to the more general field of health information management and preparation for the RHIA exam. We also hope to prepare students to not only graduate with a focused professional degree in HI, but also be ready to obtain a professional certification such as the Certified Associate in Healthcare Information and Management Systems (CAHIMS) or the Certified Health Data Analyst (CHDA).

III. Student and Workforce Demand

The use of data in healthcare is an ever growing and dynamic field, which is driving great expansion and opportunity in the field of health informatics for our graduates. The US Bureau of Labor Statistics shows the following regarding pertinent job titles for graduates of our proposed program:

- Health Information Technologists - \$55,560 avg salary (typically Associates degree), 17% growth rate (much faster than national avg)
- Information Security Analysts - \$102,600 avg salary (typically Bachelor's degree), 35% growth rate (much faster than national avg)
- Database Administrators and Architects - \$101,000 avg salary (typically Bachelor's degree), 9% growth rate (faster than national avg)
- Computer and Information Systems Managers - \$159,010 avg salary (typically Bachelor's degree), 16% growth rate (much faster than national avg)

O*Net Online from the US Department of Labor shares that health informatics specialist roles are growing nationally at 8 to 10%, but in the state of Florida are growing much more rapidly at a rate of 22%. Average salary for health informatics specialists per O*Net is \$99,270.

The American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) performs a salary survey with their membership regularly, supporting the data reported through the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Department of Labor above. The following average salary levels were noted by AHIMA members:

- Health Informatics/Data Analytics salary average: \$83,490
 - Includes the following job titles: Data Integrity Analyst, Clinical Informatics Coordinator, Project Manager, Research and Development Scientist, Director of Clinical Informatics, and more
- Health IT and Infrastructure salary average: \$98,180
 - Includes the following job titles: Implementation Support Specialist, Data Quality Manager, System Analyst, Data Architect, Chief Technology Officer, and more
- Members holding the Certified Health Data Analyst (CHDA) credential (offered by AHIMA): \$92,100

In a study released in November of 2023, AHIMA also reports that two-thirds (66 percent) of survey respondents reported understaffing of Health Informatics professionals at their organizations within the last two years, with a lack of availability of qualified candidates being a major issue. The data found in the above table shows several of these occupations growing at a percentage far above the national and state averages. The most likely occupations to be obtained by graduates of this program are in data analysis, typically occupation codes 15-1211 or 15-1212. These two occupations specifically are growing at a rate far more significant than the national and state average, providing excellent opportunities for students to obtain meaningful work in their field upon graduation. However, nearly every related occupation code is growing at a rate significantly higher than the state and national averages, so students choosing other areas of informatics will likely be successful as well.

In informal classroom and advising discussions with students in the existing Health Information Management bachelor degree program (HIIM), some expressed interest in the field of health informatics as opposed to the field of health information management. We are seeing a drop off in the number of students sitting for and receiving the RHIA credential, perhaps due to this shift in interest into a more technical informatics program. As noted previously, the proposed program is not looking to cannibalize the existing program, but simply differentiate itself based on curriculum, and growing the student base in both programs based on student interest (HIM versus HCI).

Also, a discussion regarding the program was held with the Community Advisory Board of the existing HIIM bachelors program. As working professionals in the health care industry, the members of the advisory board were excited at the prospect of this new degree program. It was felt that there is a strong need for this type of program at the undergraduate level to support entry-level roles in health IT, and that it complements the existing programs in the UCF School of Global Health Management and Informatics.

We are planning on an initial start of 25 students to grow to 88 students after 5 years. Primarily, students will come from those progressing into their upper-level courses and those transferring from other programs. To attract new students, the degree program will offer unique advantages and appeal to both internal and external candidates. Being the only bachelor's level health informatics program in the State University System will be a selling point, preparing students for careers in an industry in high demand.

The BS in Health Informatics (CIP 51.2706) at UCF will be the first undergraduate degree focused solely on health informatics offered by the SUS and will complement our existing MS in Health Informatics. This program seeks to meet the needs of the health care industry by providing high quality, innovative education focused specifically on the growing field of health informatics, to create a pool of well qualified, diverse health informatics professionals to serve both the state of Florida and the broader health care industry nationally and globally.

Per the American Health Informatics Association, there are only four undergraduate programs nationally focused solely on informatics, none located in the state of Florida. Also, the Commission on Accreditation of Health Informatics and Information Management Education (CAHIIM) is beginning in 2023 to accredit health informatics programs at the undergraduate level, and UCF could be an early adopter of this accreditation. The graduate program in HI at UCF is already accredited through CAHIIM, as is our BS in HIIM.

The only noted private institution in Florida offering a Bachelor of Science in Health Informatics is Nova Southeastern University, and at this time that program does not hold nor are they candidate for specialty accreditation through CAHIIM.

B. Describe the admissions criteria and graduation requirements for the program.

The admission standard for the BS HCI program will be the same as all other non-restricted majors at UCF. Freshman candidates must be:

- High school seniors
- High school students or graduates who earned dual enrollment credit or an AA degree but have not completed more than 11 semester hours of college coursework after high school graduation
- High school graduates who have never enrolled in college

For freshman in Fall of 2024, the mid-range (middle 50 percent) standard of our entering class was:

GPA: 4.1 – 4.5 (recalculated academic core)
 SAT: 1270 – 1390 (Evidence-based Reading and Writing + Math)
 ACT: 26 – 30 (composite)
 CLT: 90-100

For transfer students, the following admission criteria apply:

If the student will have fewer than 30 transferable semester hours of college coursework (12 or more earned after high school graduation) by the time they enroll at UCF, they must:

- Minimally meet the first-year student high school unit admission requirements
- Minimally meet the high school academic GPA and a minimum score for the SAT Reasoning or redesigned SAT, ACT, or CLT*



- Have earned a competitive overall college GPA on a 4.0 system for all academic courses attempted; GPA requirements may change by semester based on the competitiveness of the applicant pool and enrollment goals
- Be in good academic standing (minimum 2.0 GPA) overall and be eligible to return as a degree-seeking student to the last institution attended

If the student will have 30 or more but fewer than 60 transferable semester hours of college coursework (12 or more earned after high school graduation) by the time they enroll at UCF, they must:

- Minimally have successfully completed (with a “C” grade or higher) at least one English composition course and one college-level mathematics course, each consisting of three semester credit hours
- Demonstrate competency in a world language or American Sign Language equivalent to at least the second high school level (e.g. Spanish 2) or the second elementary course at the college level (e.g. SPN 1211 – Beginning Spanish II)
- Have earned a competitive overall college GPA on a 4.0 system for all academic courses attempted; GPA requirements may change by semester based on the competitiveness of the applicant pool and enrollment goals
- Be in good academic standing (minimum 2.0 GPA) overall and be eligible to return as a degree-seeking student to the last institution attended

If the student will have 60 or more transferable semester hours of college coursework (12 or more earned after high school graduation) by the time they enroll at UCF, or if the student earned an A.A. degree or state-articulated A.S. degree from a Florida public community/state college or university, they must:

- Have completed two college-level English composition courses with a grade of “C” or better
- Have completed two college-level Mathematics courses with a grade of “C” or better
- Demonstrate competency in a world language or American Sign Language equivalent to at least the second high school level (e.g. Spanish 2) or the second elementary course at the college level (e.g. SPN 1211 – Beginning Spanish II)
- Have earned a competitive overall college GPA on a 4.0 system for all academic courses attempted; GPA requirements may change by semester based on the competitiveness of the applicant pool and enrollment goals
- Be in good academic standing (minimum 2.0 GPA) overall and be eligible to return as a degree-seeking student to the last institution attended

Additional Requirements

As a requirement for the Bachelor of Science in Health Informatics, students must complete an internship in health informatics to provide experiential learning in the field. In order to participate in the HCI Internship the student must: 1) Have earned at least 90 Credit Hours prior to the start of the semester in which they must take internship orientation (a zero credit hour course); 2) Have earned at least 24 HCI Credit Hours prior to the start of the semester in which the internship begins; 3) Have a Major GPA of 2.75 prior the start of the semester in which the internship begins. Additionally, many health care organizations will require that students complete a background check, which may include, but not be limited to, law enforcement finger printing, state driving records, credit reports, and criminal records check. The cost of the background check is the student's responsibility. Background checks may take time to complete and, subsequently, could delay the student's internship placement. Students who have potential background issues must contact the Director of Internships to schedule an interview to discuss the impact on field placement. The Health Informatics Program cannot guarantee internship placement or subsequent degree completion for students who do not pass background checks and/or receive a passing grade in the Internship course.

- Students earn an overall GPA of at least 2.5 for all coursework.

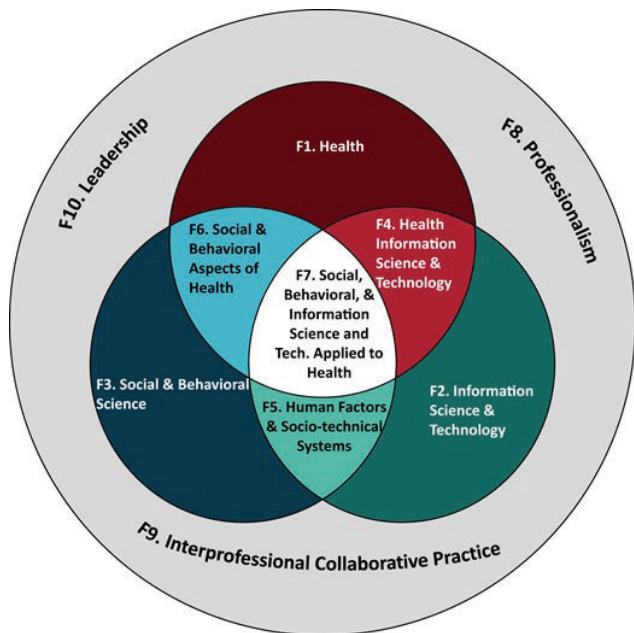

The development and inclusion of the courses noted in Section V.D above was completed with these domains and their corresponding competencies in mind. As required by CAHIIM Standard 3 “Measuring Program Effectiveness”, the program will utilize a process for measuring program effectiveness as part of a quality improvement cycle. Regular measurement of progress toward program goals and outcomes will be required. The community advisory board will be a part of this process, initially assisting in development of the metrics and in an ongoing capacity in outcomes review, quality improvement, and curricular assessment to maintain alignment with the needs of the profession. CAHIIM accredited programs are also required (per Standard 4) to create and maintain a Program Effectiveness Plan across a minimum of four areas; appropriateness and effectiveness of curriculum, assurance that educational needs of students and graduates are met, competence of faculty teaching in the program, and



response to the communities of practice related to the program. Utilizing our community advisory board in the development and ongoing review of these important initiatives will be crucial to maintaining relevance to a dynamic industry such as health informatics.

Also, per CAHIIM Standard 14, the program curriculum and course content must stay current with evolving issues and practices in health informatics, and we must demonstrate how the curriculum and course content are routinely updated and relevant. This will be accomplished through the Program Effectiveness Plan noted above, as well as with regular meetings with the program Advisory Board.

The existing Community Advisory Board for the BS in HIIM was consulted throughout the development of this program and was extremely interested and excited about the proposal. As discussed in the HIIM Advisory Board meeting on 8/16/2023, the board felt that the degree would fill a need not otherwise met with existing programs at UCF. As noted above, per CAHIIM Accreditation Standard 19, an advisory committee representative of the communities of interest is required and must be charged with the responsibility of meeting regularly to assist program faculty and sponsoring educational institution personnel. This committee will assist in formulating and periodically revising appropriate goals and curriculum, monitoring needs and expectations, and ensuring program responsiveness to change. Per a discussion with CAHIIM, we can utilize the same advisory board for multiple related programs, provided separate meetings are held. We currently plan to utilize the BS HIIM advisory board with separate meetings held for the BS HI, but will continue to monitor and may choose to create a new separate board for the BS HI program to avoid overburdening the community volunteers who serve on the advisory board.

The launch of the proposed BS in Health Informatics will have some impact on the existing BS HIIM degree and BS Health Service Administrations programs, but eventually this impact will be a positive one. Students in all programs can benefit from exposure to related but distinct areas of study. Health informatics focuses more on data analysis and technology, while health information management emphasizes organizational and administrative aspects. Students in all programs will learn together about areas like health law, ethics, healthcare reimbursement, and medical terminology. This interdisciplinary work will allow students of different majors work together in a complementary manner. Also, the introduction of a new program can generate increased interest in the fields of health information management, health service administration, and health informatics, which may attract more students to all programs.

There will be some overlap between the new BS in Health Informatics and the other two undergraduate programs in the School of Global Health Management and Informatics (HIIM & HSA), but as noted above, this overlap is a positive, allowing students to learn with their interdisciplinary colleagues in different majors.

The introduction of a new Bachelor of Health Informatics program alongside existing programs can have a variety of impacts, both positive and negative. With careful planning, collaboration, and communication, these impacts can be managed effectively to ensure the success and growth of all three programs while offering students a well-rounded education in the fields of health informatics, health information management, and health administration.

- B. Provide specific evidence demonstrating that the academic unit(s) associated with the proposed program has been productive in teaching, research, and service. Faculty teaching loads in the School of Global Health Management and Informatics are as follows: Instructors and Lecturers teach four courses (12-16 credit hours) in the fall semester and four courses (12-16 credit hours) in the spring semester (4/4 load); Tenure-earning faculty at the assistant professor rank teach two courses (3-8 credit hours) in the fall and two courses (3-8 credit hours) in the spring (2/2 load); Tenured faculty teach three courses (9-12 credit hours) in the fall and three courses (9-12 credit hours) in the spring (3/3 load).

Teaching Assignments are determined by a process involving the School Director, the Course Scheduler, Program Directors, Academic Advisors, and the individual faculty. Because of the shared faculty model in the department, scheduling of courses has been a centralized process controlled by the Course Scheduler. The process starts with requests made by individual faculty to the School Director regarding any adjustments to their teaching loads (discussed in C below). If adjustments are made, this information is shared with the Course Scheduler. The Program Directors, working with the Academic Advisors, identify the courses needed to be offered and the number of sections of each course. The Course Scheduler creates the first draft of the schedule based on input from the School Director, Program Directors, and Academic Advisors. The first draft of the schedule is shared with faculty for their input - they review classes assigned, meeting days/times and format (face-to-face, M, or W), and let scheduler know of any changes needed. All of this is completed eighteen months prior to the schedule going "live". Therefore, many changes and drafts occur over that time frame.

Course release requests are handled on a case-by-case basis by the School Director and may be given for the following reasons: supervision of academic programs (e.g., Program Director), preparation of new programs of substantial scope (e.g., creation of a new program), unusual academic or research assignments (e.g., managing large IT grant received from State), and funded research.

The program actively encourages core faculty members to engage in external consultation activities that align with their respective areas of expertise and program roles. Such activities serve to deepen the faculty's immersion in current industry practices and challenges, thereby enhancing the program's relevance and applied learning experiences. However, consultation endeavors must be carefully balanced to avoid conflicts of interest or detrimental impacts on the faculty's primary responsibilities within the department. Dr. Jillian Harrington, for instance, maintains a part-time health care compliance consulting practice, affording her valuable insights into the evolving



regulatory landscape and day-to-day operational concerns surrounding information privacy and security in the health care sector, among other areas. Similar consultation arrangements, as documented in the appended curricula vitae, allow other core faculty to remain involved with prevailing issues in their fields while enriching the department's industry connectivity.

Service to the profession is another point of emphasis for the faculty of the School of Global Health Management and Informatics (SGHMI). Dr. Reid Oetjen serves as Board Chair for the Association of University Programs in Health Administration (AUPHA), providing governance leadership. Dr. Dawn Oetjen contributes as a Fellow of the Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Management Education (CAHME), conducting site visits to prospective CAHME accreditation programs. Dr. Harrington likewise performs CAHME site visits while serving on multiple committees for AUPHA and CAHME. Both Dr. Harrington and Dr. Mark Bush serve as site reviewers for AUPHA certification programs. Dr. Michelle Crozier co-chairs the 'Women in AMIA' committee for the American Medical Informatics Association (AMIA). Beyond university, college, and school service commitments, most SGHMI faculty maintain active professional service roles.

Scholarly research is another defining characteristic of the SGHMI faculty. Dr. Barbara Andraka-Christou is a preeminent researcher in the substance use disorder domain, having recently published several articles and a sole-authored book on the topic. Dr. Varadraj Gurupur recently co-founded UCF's Center for Decision Support Systems and Informatics to facilitate interdisciplinary health informatics research collaborations. He has also secured a patent for a novel chronic illness health record management method/system and conducts extensive electronic health record research. Dr. Sung Choi has recently published on information security issues, with a focus on health data breaches. Appendix G contains comprehensive curricula vitae detailing faculty research activities.

TEACHING

College of Community Innovation and Education

HSA 6188 Health Care Capstone and Strategic Management

This coursework was designed to challenge students to think deeply, define problems and issues, and articulate solutions to strategic management issues associated with the health sector. The culminating product of the student's work will be a Project Paper and presentation that purposely integrates both business and health sector knowledge gained throughout the e-MHA experience. The Project will have an innovative and entrepreneurship intent that will take into consideration the current health reform perspectives. The student's work through the semester will also draw on experiences gained in the workplace. As a result of participation in the integrative seminar, the student will build a commitment to "evidence-based management and policy-making",

HSA 6346 Healthcare Organizational Behavior and Human Resources Management

The purpose of this class is for students to gain a solid understanding of theoretical and modeling techniques applied in a scholar-practitioner model as they apply to organizational behavior and human resources. Additionally, we seek to educate students on the principles of organizational behavior in human resource management. Understanding organizational behavior is a necessary precursor to performance-based management development, health system examination, policy formulation, and conducting quantitative analysis – to name only a few subject areas. Understanding the process of applying organization behavior knowledge areas to human resource management is one of the more critical skills that current and future healthcare leaders need today.

HSA 6342 Health Care Human Resources

This course is designed to expose students to the major issues, laws, managerial processes, procedures, and psychological factors which should be considered when developing a management system for healthcare organizations in the 21st century. The goal is to build managerial skills as well as knowledge, including modern management, human performance, and leadership.

HSA 6385 Healthcare Quality Management

This course serves as an introduction to the process of quality management in healthcare organizations. Principles of total quality management and guidelines for implementing total quality in health care will be discussed. Students will develop an informed basis for leading quality improvement efforts and will gain a broad perspective on the conceptualization and development of health status measures and their utilization in the assessment of outcomes and effectiveness in medical care.

HSA 6536 Health and Medical Terminology for Health Administrators

A study of the language of medicine and allied health specialties, including word construction, definitions, and application of terms. This course is designed to improve your vocabulary skills, prepare you for advanced professional preparation and assure mastery of this unique language.

HIM 6122 System Analysis & Design

Systems Analysis and Design focus on electronic health record applications to provide the tools for successful system implementation. Including creating a comprehensive planning document; assessing system requirements; developing design specifications; understanding criteria for vendor selection (including cost issues); and planning for installation requirements (including personnel and infrastructure). The use of current and future state analysis, along with gap analysis will be incorporated.

HSC 4564 Health Care Needs of the Elderly

The purpose of this course is to assist the student in becoming more aware of social, medical, and emotional supports in older age. Students will gain the ability to understand and interpret the aging population, and to apply the information to current healthcare issues.

HIM 3537 Medical Terminology

A study of the language of medicine and allied health specialties, including word construction, definitions, and application of terms. This course is designed to improve your vocabulary skills, prepare you for advanced professional preparation and assure mastery of this unique language.

HSA 3222 Long-Term Care Administration

This course introduces the organization, financing, and management of the institutional and community-based health and social services that comprise the long-term care delivery system.

HSA 3012 Issues and Trends in Public Health

This course provides a basic introduction to public health concepts and practice by examining the philosophy, purpose, history, organization, functions, tools, activities, and results of public health practice at the national, state, and community levels. The course also examines public health occupations and careers. The material may be of interest to healthcare administrators, clinical professionals, computer and health information managers, marketing professionals, and people with an interest in insurance, statistics, or their health.

HSA 2117 Civic Engagement in Health Care

This course is an introduction to the aspects of citizenship in the United States by focusing on health and healthcare. This course will provide an overview of the fundamental principles and concepts of US healthcare policy and the process by which healthcare services are distributed in the US. This course will include the development of a clear understanding of the social determinants of health, the impact the consumer and provider have on the overall health of the community, the development of an understanding of the structure of healthcare delivery, and your rights and duties as a consumer of healthcare in the US.

HSA 6342 Health Care Human Resources

This course is designed to expose students to the major issues, laws, managerial processes, procedures, and psychological factors which should be considered when developing a management system for healthcare organizations in the 21st century. The goal is to build managerial skills as well as knowledge, including modern management, human performance, and leadership.

HSA 6197 Health Systems Analysis

This course introduces principles and methods employed in evaluation research and program evaluation, particularly related to health care management. Emphasis will be placed on applications of evaluation research and findings to the healthcare administrators' decision-making process

HSA 6186 Health Care Leadership

This course addresses current leadership theory focusing on leadership styles, motivation, change management, innovation, and creativity as they relate to the management of health services organizations. The course will also explore ethical dilemmas facing healthcare leaders. Students will explore their leadership strengths, skills, and competencies. The course is designed to prepare students to enter healthcare organizations and understand the role of leaders in those organizations and work teams

HSA 4939 Long-Term Care Seminar

Students will attend seminars conducted/presented by faculty and other students. The seminars will focus on current issues in the long-term care field.

HSA 3564 Aging in America

This course is designed to provide a comprehensive overview of the social, economic, cultural, and demographic issues impacting aging in contemporary America. An interdisciplinary focus will be utilized in examining these issues and major trends in gerontology.

HSA3383 Quality Management in Healthcare

This course is designed to acquaint the student with quality management concepts, tools, and techniques used in the health services industry and the application of quality management theory to health care products and service outcomes.

HSA 3210 Long-Term Care Administration

This course introduces the organization, financing, and management of the institutional and community-based health and social services that comprise the long-term care delivery system.
